The Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, with 57 years of organized competition, has evolved into one of the NCAA's largest and most heralded intercollegiate athletic conferences.

The 2008-09 academic year will be a groundbreaking one for the PSAC, as the league will expand beyond its original 14 members for the first time since its official formation in 1951. New full-time members Gannon University and Mercyhurst College, along with associate member Long Island University – C.W. Post, expect to complement the PSAC's already solid foundation. With 16 full-time institutions, the PSAC shares distinction with the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference as the NCAA Division II's largest in terms of membership. League expansion has brought acclaim through postseason opportunities, as well. In 2008-09, the Conference will sponsor 23 championships, the most for leagues in Division II.

Highly competitive on a regional and national level, PSAC schools annually combine to send nearly one-third of its teams into NCAA postseason play. Ultimately, the membership's success has yielded 40 NCAA team and 218 individual title winners.

While proud of its athletic accomplishments, the league also has evolved into one of Division II's finest from an academic standpoint. Today, well over a quarter of the PSAC's estimated 5,300 participants are honored each year as "Scholar-Athletes" for maintaining a grade-point average of 3.25 or better - a total that has nearly doubled since PSAC Scholar-Athletes were first recognized in the mid-1990s.

The PSAC was organized in 1951 for the purpose of promoting and administering men's athletic programs within the 14 state teachers colleges in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. In 1977, due to the interest and growth of women's athletics, the conference was restructured to provide for women's programs.

Upon its formation, the league did not have a standard competitive division. However, in 1980, the league voted to reclassify the entire conference to NCAA Division II. Although all 16 current institutions are members of Division II, eight schools also compete at the Division I level in select sports. PSAC schools enroll over 117,000 students and claim over 661,000 alumni, including 430,000 who reside in Pennsylvania.

The PSAC is governed by the presidents of the 16 member institutions. It employs a commissioner, two assistant commissioners and a director of media relations at its headquarters in Lock Haven, Pa.

About Bloomsburg

Bloomsburg University, a member of Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education, is a four-year coeducational public university founded in 1839. Through the stages of its development from a normal school to a teachers college to a multipurpose state college and finally to a university in 1983, the institution has retained its emphasis on liberal arts and career education.



Bloomsburg is recognized as one of the best 100 public universities in the United States, and excellence, ranging from its 18 national championships to its international reputation in a number of its academic programs, is an attitude found throughout the faculty and staff.

About 90 percent of Bloomsburg's students come from throughout Pennsylvania, creating a diverse mix of cultures and ideas. It's a place where friendships that last a lifetime begin. And it's a busy place — with more than 160 student organizations and activities, NCAA Division II athletic programs and a popular recreation center.

The university's Division of Continuing and Distance Education serves students through nondegree credit courses, noncredit minicourses, off-campus classes, credit for life experience and distance learning courses on public television.

The Town of Bloomsburg, located in the Susquehanna River Valley, has a population of about 12,000 people. The central business district is just three blocks southwest of campus, and includes more than 80 retail stores, restaurants, and the Bloomsburg Fair in September. More stores, restaurants and theaters can be found along nearby Route 11 and at the Columbia Mall, northwest of town.

The university is within a one-hour drive from such cities as Hazleton, Williamsport, Wilkes-Barre and Scranton; 1.5 hours from Harrisburg; 2.5 hours from Philadelphia; 3 hours from New York City and Baltimore; and four hours from Pittsburgh and Washington, DC.

QUICK FACTS

Enrollment— Total enrollment is over 8,040 with an average incoming SAT of 1070 and class rank in the upper 25 percent; Bloomsburg admits one in seven applicants and has a four-year retention rate significantly higher than the national average. About 60 percent are women and 10 percent are non-traditional. About 90 percent of Bloomsburg graduates are quickly placed in their chosen fields.

Faculty— With approximately 1,000 employees, Bloomsburg University has 383 full-time faculty, 70 percent of whom hold doctoral degrees and 72 percent of whom are tenured. The staff is organized into four divisions: Academic Affairs, Administration, Student Life and University Advancement. Governance is through the State System of Higher Education's Board of Governors and through the university's Council of Trustees.

Degrees— Bloomsburg University offers 63 baccalaureate degrees, one associate degree, 19 master's degrees and a joint doctoral degree in elementary education in cooperation with Indiana University of Pennsylvania.

Financial Aid— About 70 percent of all students receive some form of financial aid.

School Colors, Mascot— The school colors of Bloomsburg University, originally "lemon and garnet," have been maroon and gold since the 1920s. In the early 1930s, the Husky became the school mascot when a dog owned by a faculty member accompanied Adm. Richard E. Byrd on an expedition to the South Pole.

Head Coach Sandy Dickson

Sandy Dickson begins her 11th season as head coach. Only the second coach in the history of Bloomsburg University women's soccer, she was named to the position in March of 1998. In her first 10 seasons as head coach, Dickson has guided the Huskies to six PSAC playoff berths, one undefeated regular season, two PSAC championships and a berth in three NCAA championship tournaments. During the 2000 season she led the Huskies to the NCAA Division II quarterfinals, while in 1998 she was named the PSAC and NSCAA Mid-Atlantic Regional Coach of the Year. She is Bloomsburg's all-time leader in coaching wins for women's soccer with a mark of 107-69-22.

Dickson, who was an assistant coach at Bloomsburg for three years before taking over as head coach, is a 1994 graduate of Rutgers University. At Rutgers, she was a four-year member of the women's soccer team, serving as captain during her senior year. As a midfielder, she helped the Scarlet Knights to three Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) titles (1990-92) and a ranking of 13th in the nation in Division I.

As a high school performer, Dickson was named a regional All-American in both 1988 and 1989 and was named the 1989 New Jersey South Midfielder of the Year in addition to all-state honors.

Dickson, who holds the NSCAA National Diploma coaching license, also holds a master's degree in Exercise Science from Bloomsburg.

Assistant Coach David Shemilt / 2008 Roster



Beginning his first season as an assistant coach with the Bloomsburg University women's soccer team is David Robert Shemilt.

A native of Stoke-on-Trent, England, UK, Shemilt comes to Bloomsburg after serving one year as Assistant Men's Coach at King's College, Wilkes-Barre, PA. Prior to that he was an assistant coach of the Bloomsburg University men's soccer team.

Shemilt has worked a number of MLS camps as a player development officer/coach within a number of different soccer clubs with stops in in Alaska, Connecticut, Chicago, Michigan, San Francisco and San Jose, CA, along with stops in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and New York. He was involved with coaching recreational, travel, and elite teams while also instructing coaches.

As a player, he competed for six years with Port Vale F.C. in England, playing in the club's school of excellence, then in the Youth Training Scheme (YTS) before embarking on his coaching career. He began his

coaching career in England where he became English Football Association (EFA) certified.

He spent six months in Groningen, Holland during an exchange program, studying at The Hanze-hogeschool, a teaching academy for physical education teachers. While there, he coached Oranje Nassau, a semi-professional team in Holland. He also became KNVB certified, the equivalent of NSCAA certification.

He earned a Bachelor of Science (Hons) degree in Sports Science from the University of Worcester, England, in 2004 before completing his Master of Science degree in Sport Science from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in December, 2006. He is currently pursuing another master's degree at Bloomsburg University.

2008 Season Preview

The 2008 Bloomsburg University women's soccer team will welcome several new players, while returning a veteran squad laden with experience.

After finishing third in the PSAC East in 2007, the Huskies fell short of their goal of a PSAC title after falling to East Stroudsburg 1-0 in the playoffs. "We have several talented newcomers, along with the current squad members that should help move us further towards reaching our goals," said Dickson. "Our goal is to win the PSAC Championship and receive a bid to the NCAA championships."

However, for the Huskies to meet those goals they must gel in the goal and find balanced offensive production if they are to compete in the PSAC East. Their strong nucleus of experienced players has the necessary tools to succeed.

DEFENSE

One of the most anticipated competitions in pre-season camp will be for the goalkeeper. After an intense summer of training sophomore Vicky Ziolkowski will get her chance to compete for the starting position along with several talented freshmen prospects. Those prospects include Frances Nicoletti, Samantha Davis, and Marissa McDowell.

In the back, the Huskies return two All-PSAC centerbacks, Eileen Alexander and Kristine Preski. Alexander, a very complete soccer player, is most effective when in command of the backline with her voice and decision making ability. Preski is coming off a stellar freshmen outing and Alexander provides the leadership on the backline. Also returning are seniors Angela Brown, and juniors Jourdan Fedusenko, Meg Lynch, and Erin Coulahan. Both Brown and Fedusenko are seasoned starting backs and know what it takes to win in the PSAC. Fedusenko brings one of the highest fitness levels to the team, and Brown is an intense outside back with hard tackling ability. Lynch comes into her junior season with a lot of experience, and continues to improve her game on the backline. Coulahan looks to return to form after battling nagging injuries.

MIDFIELD

Returning on the left-side will be All-PSAC junior Kelly Modes who possesses a gifted left foot, endurance and toughness. She will play a huge role in the success of the team this fall.

Also returning is first team All-PSAC performer Lauren Hess who is a tall, athletic attacking midfielder. She has the ability has the role of controlling the air game, and providing goals in crucial situations. Also, expect to see a significant contribution from sophomore Ali McCrossin in the center midfield. McCrossin is very smart tactically, and composed on

the ball. She will be called on to run the middle of the field.

Juniors Christine Wason and Karen Lindell also return in the midfield. Lindell is a very technical player and has great tactical awareness. Wason is a strong, hard nosed midfielder that can win battles. Also look for seniors Mary Sciacchetano and Kate Armitage to provide consistent work-rates for the Huskies. Sciacchetano is very fit and can play almost anywhere, while Armitage is one of the quickest players in the PSAC in her wide role. Jen McLean and Suzie Wade could see themselves both in the midfield and at forward this season, as both provide scoring punch. Freshman Katie Walczuk, has a solid club background, and will challenge the returners for playing time.

FORWARDS

Senior captain Ashley Brucker returns and will work with sophomores Kelsey Stoka and Meg Donlon as well as juniors Wade and McLean to provide scoring punch this fall.

Brucker, perhaps the purest athlete on the team is strong in the air, and can physically punish opponents. Her leadership as the Huskies captain has been invaluable to the program and she will be looked at to provide that once again in 2008.

Both Donlon and Stoka proved that they can put the ball in the net in their freshmen campaigns. Donlon earned All-PSAC honors as a freshman, and led the team in goals despite missing the end of the season due to injury. An intense forward, she possesses a natural nose for the goal and makes things happen every time she is in the attacking third.

Kelsey Stoka, a strong one-on-one player, will be asked to score goals, and distribute the ball in the box.

Perhaps the team's most individually committed player is junior Suzie Wade who continues to improve and will be asked to provide offense for the Huskies this fall. Freshmen Kelsey Goodman, and Lauren Mento will also compete for playing time on the frontline.

A new era begins in the NCAA Northeast region as the NCAA has realigned the regions to compose the Northeast Region from the PSAC conference and the WVIAC in West Virginia. Six teams from the Northeast region will receive bids to the NCAA Championships in 2008, including an automatic bid for the PSAC Championship winner.
